3. Public Comment – Chair Midby

Public comment will be taken during this agenda item. Comments may be limited to three minutes per person at the discretion of the chairperson. Members of the public may

4. **She Shapes Nevada (For Possible Action)**

Chair Midby said at our last regular meeting we talked about the possibility of doing an event for Women's History Month and Vice Chair Friedenthal reminded her that we had decided to do a She Shapes Nevada event down here in Las Vegas, which is wonderful so we are aiming to do that; a few things we need to decide to do on this call today is essentially the venue, and Commissioner DiLullo has offered up The Palm as a venue free of charge and her caterers as well. Chair Midby wanted to turn this over to Vice Chair Friedenthal because they had an events committee meeting where they talked about other locations and Commissioner McDoniel offered up the Anthem Country Club which had a \$3,000 food and beverage cost. Vice Chair Friedenthal said Commissioner McDoniel probably has updates for us and we can go from there. Commissioner McDoniel said she reached out to her community here at Anthem, we have a clubhouse and we do have a room that is sometimes used for weddings and it's a beautiful space with a Strip view and is very pretty. There is however a cost and that is just for food and beverage, but they are willing to waive the room fee, which is great because they typically charge a fee to also have the room. Depending on what we want to do, we could do a lunch from 11-1 or 2, but we were saying this on the last meeting that maybe we want to do more of a happy hour a little bit later maybe from 4-6 or 7 and if we did that, we can do some passed appetizers and some beer and wine or soda if we don't want to do a full bar to cut costs. It is a beautiful space, and she can send the pictures to Ms. Freitas who can share it with everyone. There is a cost associated with food and beverages, so this is something that we need to decide if we want to do because Commissioner DiLullo has a spot with food and beverage provided. Again, it's a very beautiful space and it would definitely make an impact with the room and how beautiful it is, but there is a cost associated with it. We could have the room for about 2.5-3-hours, and \$3,000 was the food and beverage minimum so we would have to be scraping by a little bit there and they also charge for staff to work there for about \$150/person so we would need about 3 people for a bartender and servers to walking around and pass out the appetizers, so that would be an additional charge as well. They also charge for linens, but I do have a friend that also has an events planning company that I'm sure we could get linens from with no cost. It is available for that day. Vice Chair Friedenthal said one of the points we need to talk about as well before we make a decision is the event that we hosted here in Northern NV that we did in the fall we did charge because this is the type of event that has a good caliber or good expectation for what we are offering which has value to it so the cost was \$50/person. The cost did not seem to be an issue for anyone and also people have skin in the game because if it's open and no cost there will be 200 people saying they will come but only 100 show up which is my experience, so I think when you do ask people to register and there is a nominal fee, we weren't looking to make any money in the fall, we just wanted to break even, I think if we do this correctly this could become a money-maker and in my mind that is the goal long-term is for these to be events that people will

want to be at and they are willing and excited to pay for to be in the room and have this be a revenue source for the Commission and Nevada Women's Fund or whatever that looks like in the future with partnerships. It doesn't matter to NWF, but we would cover costs with the price of registration or admission. Chair Midby thanked them for the updates and asked Commissioner McDoniel for the date. Commissioner McDoniel said March 19 is the date they were looking at and they typically open dinner service but can alternate that around the event so she asked for the 19th and they said yes, it's available. Chair Midby asked if that date works for the majority of the Commissioners if we were to do an early afternoon sort of happy hour event that day to make sure we have critical mass of our people that can attend. Commissioner Brown said it's a terrible week for her because she is probably looking at colleges and its over spring break and she doesn't have to be there but that is probably a terrible week for her. Chair Midby said that's a great point because it's Clark County School District's spring break, so she thinks a lot of people are going to be traveling and that's probably something we need to consider. Commissioner DiLullo said that date works for her but she's an empty nester which is why it worked and she didn't realize that it was spring break. Commissioner McDoniel said if they have any other dates, they told me that if they want to go this route, to just let them know and they will schedule dinner service around any date they want which was pretty nice. Chair Midby said that it is super nice and that date works for her as well since her kids aren't going to college any time soon, so no college vacations for us at the moment. Commissioner Proper said it currently works for her as well, but she is thinking in the way of attendees and so we have mass for us to attend, there might be an issue or concern there. Vice Chair Friedenthal asked if we want to look a week earlier like March 12th because she likes Thursdays for these type of events but either date works for her, but it would be great if the majority of us could be there and the majority of women who wanted to attend could be there so maybe a week earlier would be great. Commissioner Proper said she likes Thursday's and she likes the 12th. Commissioner Rogers Markwell asked if we had any idea on the demographic overall that have attended these, like are they folks with kids in school at this time or in college to see if this would be a big impact. Obviously not having Commissioner Brown there would also be a big impact, but for everyone else is there a large demographic that this overlaps? Commissioner DiLullo said if it's in the evening she would say yes but if it's just a lunch it may not impact as much, but if we're going to do it in the evening and I know just on a different organization that I served on, we tried to do a larger event during spring break and we did have a lot less attendance so I think we do have to be mindful of that. The 12th works for her, and she does love that space and has been up there. Chair Midby said that she agrees with these points and that for maximum attendance, since we are trying to get as many people as we can there still being semi-new at this, although it's sort of a branded event because of the backing of the Nevada Women's Fund, I think we should potentially look at the other date. She said she thinks we have the budget to do something, but we could also charge. Last time we checked, we had about \$29,000 sort of cash on hand for lack of a better term, so I do think for these sort of events because it's some kind of signature event for us, and we aren't planning on doing a million of these per year, I think it would be worthwhile to spend money on but having a free space is also great. We could charge even if it's not \$50, but like \$20 or \$30 to cover a majority of the cost and do very well. We always have the other location as a backup for future events. Commissioner

McDoniel said she did want to bring up that the room is for about 130 people, but she's seen more people in there, and if we are getting 200 people it would need to be standing tables because she doesn't know about the seating. She said she will go in there and ask about the maximum amount of people who can be there because it's a very big room but if we are expecting 200 people then it might be a little squished, but if we're thinking 130 people then it could work. How many people do we think we are going to have? Vice Chair Friedenthal said it would be great to sell out and create excitement for the next event because it was so good they sold out instead of it being in a room they can't fill. Chair Midby said based on the last one of these, she thinks we had about 40-50 and that might even be a little bit generous when we were at the law school so even if we could get 100 people, that would be close to selling out and that would be a very successful event in her mind. We shouldn't worry too much about the maximum amount of people and we can always turn people down which does create sort of a buzz. Commissioner McDoniel said there is sort of an outside patio that does kind of connect and they did say if we had more people, we could open the doors and it's beautiful out there. They have lights and everything and the weather will probably be pretty nice by then. Commissioner Woodrow said she has a question; how do we get the message out in terms of people, in terms of attendance vs word of mouth? Is there any marketing, is there any PR, or a press release that goes out, is there an agenda for the actual event, and if so, what does the agenda look like, or is it just cocktails? Chair Midby said that's a great question and said at the last She Shapes Nevada event we did it was basically a panel of women who are from different sectors who contribute to the community. We did do a little bit of brainstorming about what that looks like, maybe you know someone, a woman from the arts who's you know, having great contributions there. Maybe someone from the sports sector, perhaps someone from tech, someone from essentially sort of like community transportation/infrastructure or something like that and potentially gaming which is sort of a 4 or 5 women panel that's moderated and just, you know, questions related to their experience about how they benefit and shape the community. If you have some suggested names, we could run them by this group as well. That's kind of the format of the event. Secondly, last year we had with the help of the Department of Administration, they sort of created a little flyer/invite that we circulated and shared on social media, and we all shared it via our own networks. We could always do a better job of distributing that and having a more formal distribution process so any insight or advice on that is welcome, but that's essentially how we did it last year. Ms. Freitas said following up on that, in the NRS and Commission guidelines, it does say we can do a press release, so that might be something to add for this group of putting together some kind of press release and going to different media outlets just to get it out there as well and then we can also put it on our Linktree, and we can have invitation links and ticket purchasing links. Chair Midby asked if Ms. Freitas would be handling all of that and she said yes. Commissioner Woodrow said, and depending on what the date is, because from her understanding 3/19 won't work, so somewhere around that time and technically, we're about almost 6 weeks out, so are there any type of save the dates that go out or is it just once a date is determined that's when the wheels start to roll as far as getting the communication out for the people who would potentially attend, and I'm in agreement in terms of charging, and I don't think \$50 is a lot, but again, I do think and agree with the fact that when you charge for something, the opportunity for people to actually come because they've already made a

commitment I think is good, but I also think it gauges names that potentially we could work with in the community in the future for other events or opportunities that come up to show that there's really an interest and then after the event, is there any type of press release that goes out just speaking about the success at the event, just really talking about the amount of attendance that exceeded expectations if you will? Is there a goal that we set in terms of how many people we would like to attend because I'm hearing 200 or 150, and I think that's wonderful, but then do we actually measure that once we start to see people sign up and pay for potentially a ticket to attend? And then if we are potentially 6 weeks out, and understanding that there potentially is a panel, if there's a panel that's put together whether its notable people, ladies that are in the community, or leaders, then 1 - getting on their schedule, then 2 - the opportunity for a press release to really speak about that potential leader or that leader who has contributed in the community greatly is a is a potentially wonderful draw. Chair Midby said those are fabulous ideas and we should do all of those and honestly execute on that. She said the press release and showcasing kind of a postmortem of the event and how successful it and getting double traction for it would be great. She knows we are short on time and ensuring that we have availability for these speakers so it might be good for this group to decide on a location and maybe Commissioners McDoniel and DiLullo can confirm some dates and then reach out to the proposed panelists and give them 2 dates to choose from, like Thursday the 12th or Thursday the 26th. Vice Chair Friedenthal said please not the 26th. Commissioner McDoniel said she already inquired for the 12th and 26th for that space, and the 19th is also a go. Vice Chair Friedenthal shared her screen to show Commissioner Woodrow and everyone else what they did at the last event for She Shapes Nevada which was a collaborative event between 3 groups; The Nevada Commission for Women, The International Women's Forum and She Shapes Nevada. She the flyer that was created in the North and said they did do all of the things Commissioner Woodrow was talking about and this flyer for the South was a very inaugural event just trying to figure out how to do it. The third event will be just building on them and doing better. We've chosen a list of 6 topics that we can use for the She Shapes Nevada speaker series: 1 - Women Shaping Our Cities and Communities, 2 - Education, Expertise, and Experience: The Path to Leadership, 3 - Confidence, Authenticity, and Ethical Leadership, 4 - Cultural Intelligence and Inclusive Leadership, 5 - Mentorship, Sponsorship, and Allyship: Lifting as You Rise, and 6 - Networking and Influence - The Female Way. We thought topic #1 would work because we are doing it in both the North and the South during Women's History Month in March. Other She Shapes Nevada series might only happen in the North or only happen in the South, but because this is so specific, it's nice that we are going to have women who can speak specifically to what is happening in Clark County and here in the North with what's happening in Northern Nevada. Going forward we can look at these other topics and be very specific on the speakers that we choose that can best speak to these topics. Nevada Women's Fund calls the month of March our Superbowl so we are talking with every media outlet, there's a lot of promotion that happens around Women's History Month and International Women's Day, so Nevada Women's Fund obviously isn't the spokesperson for the Commission, but any events that are happening we are promoting, promoting, promoting, and that's just part of their platform. Vice Chair Friedenthal shared the Nevada Women's Fund's website on her screen to show the calendar of events under "events". There is a countdown to Women's

History Month and the calendar below. This event will go on the calendar either on the 12th, the 19th, or the 26th, whatever we decide. You can click on the event and get the information which goes right to purchasing the tickets, so what we want to do is drive people to the Nevada Women's Fund website where they will be buying these. There are some systems in place, but it is all very new to us in this collaborative effort so all of your (Commissioner Woodrow's) questions are really smart because you're making all of the points that we are trying to achieve. Commissioner Woodrow thanked Vice Chair Friedenthal for sharing all of that. Commissioner Brown said she has a couple of comments for Commissioner Woodrow: we tried last time to get media, so thank you for bringing that up because we are the deadline for all of that so it's very important, and I have maybe an opinion and a thought but she can go either way, but Commissioner DiLullo is really active in the community so I think anything that we did with her company might bring a bigger draw than if we just did Anthem, but I do know that Palm Mortuary is kind of little where the event would be, and I think that's what we have to decide, but I do think Commissioner DiLullo brings some pizzaz to an event. Commissioner DiLullo thanked Commissioner Brown and said her space will always be available to this Commission, and she's lucky because we have them and we have big places to have these events and the one that she offered is nice because it looks more like an event center and not a funeral home, but she appreciates what she (Commissioner Brown) is saying about her influence and what she would say to that is if she promotes it for Anthem, she thinks it would be the same impact if that makes sense because being a member of IWF, she's already with access to hundreds of women that she can share this to that love to support different things that we do in this community as well as other organizations so she doesn't know if the venue would necessarily matter as far as getting people to come. She thinks we would be okay at either place and if people were cautioned to go because it is Palm Mortuary, she thinks it makes sense to do it at the country club because it is a beautiful space and maybe more people would come there than to her place, and that it's worth a try to see because her space is always available to us. She also mentioned that she thinks charging \$25 makes sense as opposed to \$50 because she thinks there's a lot of free events in Southern Nevada for women in the month of March. There might be some women, even affluent women that are thinking they aren't going to pay \$50 when they have 10 other things that they are going to this week that they don't have to pay for, so \$25 makes sense and they would be willing to do that. Chair Midby thanked Commissioner DiLullo for the generosity and said it's nice to know that they have a space regardless of any other factors for these events which does not go unnoticed and they super appreciate that. Chair Midby said it looks like for this event that we want to move forward with the Anthem Country Club which is available on March 12th from the 4:30-6pm timeframe if that's what we are thinking because it doesn't need to be too much longer even though the space is available for 3 hours and we can make it an hour and a half and people mingle for a bit with maybe an hour-long panel, so maybe 2 hours and people can hang around after if they wanted for a few minutes, but make the program about an hour so that people can have a time. Chair Midby asked Vice Chair Friedenthal if it's safe to assume since they had that flyer, if we can do something similar and replicate that and just plug and play kind of a thing. Vice Chair Friedenthal said as soon as we pick the date and the location, they will redo this flyer with no talking heads and then as soon as we have the heads, we will throw those in as well. Then we

will add it to the website, and we can all start promoting it and driving people to purchase tickets which can be done in 24 hours from the time we make the decision for time, date, and location. Chair Midby said that is fantastic and that we can do it in sort of a multi-part thing, so that will be our plan schedule and then we can work on a draft of that as soon as Commissioner McDoniel hears back from Anthem about weather that date is available. Chair Midby said she agrees with Commissioner DiLullo that \$25, especially for us first out the gate that it's a more reasonable fee for what we are giving them. She said if there is other feedback on that, she's not wed to that by any means but to move forward as well as pricing and recoup some of our costs that might allow to spend maybe a little more than the minimum depending on the food choices and you (Commissioner McDoniel) can get that back to us as well, but it sounds like we've decided on those types of things. Chair Midby said to work on confirming that space and date in our committees not violating OML and then confirm it all by our February 5th meeting to make sure everything is going out properly to give us sufficient time unless we want to do a save the date once we know the space is available. Chair Midby also said it makes sense to make sure that we have speakers before we send out any sort of communication and she wants to throw out that she did some brainstorming with a few of us, so some names for consideration are Heather Harmon who is going to be the new Executive Director of the Nevada Museum for Art in Southern Nevada and she thinks she would be phenomenal to represent the art community in a place where they are also trying to get community support, so she would be wonderful. For sports we talked about Sandra Douglass Morgan and I said she's kind of everywhere at this point and she loves her, she's a friend, she's amazing, and also someone like Nikki Fargas of the Aces who would be someone different if we have connections there and could get her sort of representing the sports community. For transportation and infrastructure, MJ Maynard is the head of the RTC and she would be a very good addition to the group in that realm. Someone from tech – Heather Brown is a bit younger, she's a university regent and works at the Black Bear Innovation Center with sort of all the tech startups there, she sort of helped spearhead that which might be an interesting and sort of different demographic. Those were just some names that we brainstormed that we think might be good, but she's welcome to any other suggestions and we probably should make sure that we are talking to those folks and having a priority and a backup list to make sure we fill out our panel with some phenomenal folks. Vice Chair Friedenthal said to reiterate – speakers will be hitting each of those different community sectors for art, tech, sports, maybe gaming, and transportation/infrastructure. Once you get someone to commit, we will need a headshot and bio for each speaker because if we can get those quickly then we can get those flyers dialed in and start promoting those speakers and put the press release together quickly. Commissioner Woodrow asked if we do anything in regard to health and wellness. Chair Midby said that would be a great sector to include too, but we don't want our panel to be too big for this one so we just need to decide, and it might be based on who's available on March 12th. Vice Chair Friedenthal said the way she's reading the topic Women Shaping Our cities and Communities is more on the macro than the micro how the big picture of what's changing and the direction of the development and progress of a community. Commissioner Woodrow said she is thinking of the Lu Ruvo Center and Larry and Camille and Kate Song and that type of thing and kind of what they've done from health and wellness. She thinks we have great

representation and that's just a question. Commissioner Brown said she agrees with the health and so maybe what we do is reach out to these 4 ladies and see if they're available and if one of them is not, maybe we jump to health and wellness. Commissioner DiLullo said she has a contact at the Aces so she can reach out in that regard. Chair Midby said that would be amazing and she figured maybe she could figure out a contact too but if you can reach out, that would be amazing. She said she obviously has contacts for the other 3 and did mention it already to Heather Harmon when she saw her at another event last week and she was like "I would love to do that", but I didn't mention dates and logistics of course, but depending on her availability, she was very willing and I'm sure others would be happy to make those initial calls and report back to the group if people are comfortable with that and those names, but this was sort of meant to be brainstorming if others have great ideas we are welcome to them as always. Chair Midby asked if there were any concerns with the names listed or reaching out to them. Nobody had any. Chair Midby said she knows Vice Chair Friedenthal was the moderator for it last time and asked if anyone else would want to or if she could be volun-told again. She said she was a tremendous moderator, and it makes sense given her expertise and collaboration helping us get off the ground, and we would love to have her do it again and everyone nodded in agreement. Chair Midby said she thinks we all have our marching orders and she will reach out to those individuals for speakers and go with the March 12th date and if that's not available, we can pivot accordingly and go towards another group and other sectors because Commissioner Woodrow, that's a great idea once we confirm the location. Chair Midby asked Ms. Freitas if we need a motion to approve any of this because we can't discuss anything else or make any other actions. Ms. Freitas said we can do that just to be safe, but she will need to specifically put the cost for it, so she will need to know once the date and the venue is confirmed she will just need all of that information so he can put specifically in each agenda item \$3,000 for the venue or whatever the cost is broken up and then we will have to do another meeting for that or we can just do it at the February 5th meeting. Chair Midby said to just add it to the next agenda and she is entertaining a motion to have this She Shapes Nevada event from 4:30-6:30 on March 12th at the Anthem Country Club pending final determination of the cost and that we are working on getting panelists for that. Vice Chair Friedenthal made the motion. Commissioner Rogers Markwell seconded it. All were in favor, none opposed. The motion carries. Chair Midby said we will circle back with more information as we get it.

5. **Subcommittee Report (For Possible Action)**

Chair Midby said we pretty much covered all of it, so we can skip this item if there is no discussion. Everyone agreed we could skip this item.

6. **Women's History Month Event Planning (For Possible Action)**

Chair Midby said we could talk about this agenda item too if there is anything else to add. Vice Chair Friedenthal said that the next event to think about going forward can be the She Shapes Nevada event with the report that we are doing with the Guinn Center. She thinks sharing that report will be really impactful and should absolutely be part of the She Shapes Nevada speaker series. Chair Midby said absolutely and it makes sense to have it be part of the series and it would be great. As a Board Member of the Guinn Center, she

knows that they would also welcome the ability to collaborate and love the opportunity to release that report through an event as well, so maybe we can add them as a collaborator, and she thinks that's a phenomenal idea and if we are going to do this, it would be a great draw and perhaps we can aim towards doing one of these in the North and the South. We can address that in the summer or fall or whenever the report is ready and this could be a great cadence and book end at the end for this event at the end of the year. Chair Midby said to keep this as a standing agenda item, so we have the ability to talk about the future event. Vice Chair Friedenthal said one of our partners on this is the Morello group who owns the Sahara, and they have offered the Sahara as a place for us to present the report at the theatre, so that's nice that it will be an option we can discuss as we get a little bit closer. Chair Midby said that's wonderful and we will keep it on our agenda for the next time. Ms. Freitas said that the last thing she has for them from the Director's Office for the March event is travel, so she would just need to know which Commissioners would possibly be traveling to Las Vegas so she can put in those requests if you want it to come from the 1029 fund. Vice Chair Friedenthal said that the event in the North is on March 11th, and of course, we would like any Commissioners to attend the event in the North on March 11th as well and she feels bad that she didn't say that sooner. Chair Midby asked Vice Chair Friedenthal to circulate that event information to Ms. Freitas so she can circulate it to all the Commissioners in case we don't have it yet. Vice Chair Friedenthal said the flyer is actually being made today because we just got all of our speakers for this said event late last week. She said she does plan on going to Vegas on the 12th or 19th or whenever we decide. Ms. Freitas asked if she will be using 1029 for that and she said if she can, yes please. Commissioner Rogers Markwell also said she is planning on traveling for it as well, but she will pay for it herself. Ms. Freitas said the final-final thing from the Director's Office then is that all of this information is good to send to her but to keep in mind that there cannot be a quorum in an email chain but anything that you all decide in your different committees or just information that you have and want to be distributed to the rest of Commission, you can always send it to her and then she can send it out. If you have anything at all, please send it to her and as soon as she gets flyers and more information on her end, she will be sending that out as well. Chair Midby said we can move to the final agenda item if there is nothing else for that.
